Mary's response to the Annunciation was, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." Can you imagine any of us responding in that way to such an outrageous request? In essence she raised no question, did not negotiate for a better deal, just said okay, fine, and trusted in God. Mary risked her own life for she could have been stoned for becoming pregnant out of wedlock and risked the reputation and fortunes of her family to bring into the world our Savior. Perhaps this year you could dwell on the story of the Annunciation. Get out your Bible and read Luke 1:21-38.
